APPLICATION OF CENTURYLINK, INC.

Project: Springfield – South 132nd Street

1. A listing of all companies associated with the proposed broadband project.

Qwest Corporation d/b/a CenturyLink QC will provide the broadband and voice components in this project. CenturyLink QC is an incumbent local exchange carrier in Nebraska. The point of contact is:

2. A description of the proposed broadband project plan.

This project would provide broadband service at 4 Mbps download and 1 Mbps upload to approximately 102 living units in the area of South 132nd Street and Buffalo Road. The area is in the Springfield exchange.

3. A description of which areas are “unserved” or “underserved.”

Based on the end-of-year 2012 data from the National Telecommunications and Information Administration, the proposed project area encompasses some areas that are currently unserved and some areas that are currently served by broadband service at varying speeds. Please see Attachment A for the census blocks that will be impacted by this project.

4. An electronic map.

5. An estimate of the number of potential new broadband subscribers.

This project will provide broadband service to approximately 102 living units, of which CenturyLink believes that approximately 1 living unit currently does not have access to broadband service and approximately 97 living units currently have access to broadband at speeds less than 3 Mbps download. CenturyLink believes the 4 remaining living units have access to broadband at speeds greater than 3 Mbps download.

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6. A schedule for broadband deployment.

CenturyLink QC intends to complete the buildout and deployment of broadband within 24 months of receiving NUSF-92 funding approval. Within 6 months of approval of the application, CenturyLink will complete the planning and engineering for this project. Within 6 months of the completion of the planning and engineering, CenturyLink will complete the placement of the cable needed for this project. Within 6 months of the cable placement, the equipment will be placed. Finally, within 6 months of the equipment placement, CenturyLink will test the newly placed facilities and turn up service.

7. A proposed budget.

8. Proposed retail pricing.

The retail pricing for the proposed project area will be the same as the retail pricing for broadband services in CenturyLink QC's service territory in Nebraska. The pricing will vary depending on the speed the subscriber chooses. The monthly recurring price for CenturyLink QC's broadband service is as follows:

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CenturyLink High Speed Internet service requires the customer to also subscribe to voice service. Pure broadband does not require voice service.

If the customer chooses to lease a modem from CenturyLink QC, the monthly recurring cost would be \$8.00 per month.

A number of nonrecurring charges may apply to the customer:

Activation (broadband only)	\$19.95
Standard Installation (1 computer)	\$49.95
Standard Installation (2-5 computers)	\$99.95

9. The applicant's commitment to offer broadband services within the project service area for a minimum of five years.

CenturyLink QC commits that it will offer broadband service to the customers in the proposed project area for a minimum of 5 years.

10. The applicant's commitment to provide broadband data to the Commission.

CenturyLink QC commits that it will provide broadband data to the Commission and its vendors for the duration of the State Broadband Data and Development program for the proposed project area.

11. The applicant's financial qualifications.

CenturyLink QC files an Annual Report Form M with the Nebraska Commission. This report details CenturyLink QC's financial qualifications.

12. If no certificate of public convenience and necessity, a demonstration of the applicant's financial, technical, and managerial competence.

13. The applicant's financial match.




