Notice Regarding Eligibility of Personal Computing Devices

The Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) periodically receives requests for financial assistance in providing certain wireless personal computing devices such as iPads/tablets/other personal computing devices in the Nebraska Specialized Telecommunications Equipment Program (NSTEP). <u>This notice serves to clarify</u> inconsistent treatment between eligible speech generating devices (SGDs) and iPads/tablets/other personal computing devices reconfigured as SGDs.

Discussion Regarding Statutory Definition. Nebraska law defines Specialized Telecommunication Equipment as, "Specialized telecommunications equipment means any telecommunications device enabling deaf, hard of hearing, or speech-impaired persons to communicate using conventional telephone systems." *Neb. Rev. Stat.* § 86-310.

The Commission's policy has consistently allowed for speech generating devices (SGDs) since these devices employ an 'other adaptive technology/function' in allowing communication for speech-impaired individuals. Note that under this treatment, standalone devices such as iPads/tablets/other computing devices are disallowed as they do not serve the primary function of communication for individuals with speech disabilities.

II. Personal Computing Devices Clarification Regarding Eligibility:

The following criteria shall be followed when allowing iPads/tablets/other personal computing devices for applicants requesting assistance in the NSTEP program:

The device must be a dedicated speech-generating device (SGD). Speech-generating devices, also known as voice output communication aids, are electronic devices used to supplement or replace speech or writing specifically for use by individuals with a speech disability.
Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) Devices. The term

Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) Devices. The term, 'AAC' device is often used interchangeably with terms such as speech-

generating device (SGD) or assistive communication device or simply communication device. **Note** the term 'AAC' when used within the NSTEP context shall always be analogous to a dedicated speech-generating device outfitted with AAC software;

- Apps/Other software. Apps or other software provided separately from the device shall <u>not</u> be allowed in the program as this does not satisfy the term 'Specialized Telecommunication Equipment' (STE);
- 3) Vendors are still subject to the maximum allowable voucher expenditure in this program which is \$1,000 (including taxes).
