SPEED TESTING OVERVIEW

This document is meant to provide a general overview of the Nebraska Public Service Commission's speed testing requirements. This document does not include detailed information regarding each program. For more information, please consult orders issued in NUSF-133 and in individual programs. Programs Subject to Speed Testing

- Broadband Deployment Support (NUSF-99)
- Ongoing high-cost support (NUSF-108)
- Nebraska Broadband Bridge Program (C-5272, C-5368, C-5484, C-5561)
- Capital Projects Fund (CPF-1, CPF-2)
- PRO-AG Connectivity (C-5529, C-5600)

Required Speeds and Latency

- Speeds must meet the minimum standards which apply to the area tested. Please refer to individual program guidance.
- 80% of tests must achieve 80% of the required speeds.
- New in 2024: at least one test per location must meet or exceed 100% of the required speeds.
- New in 2024: latency testing is <u>not</u> required for fiber-to-the-premises projects unless requested by the Department
- If latency testing is required, at least 95% of test results must demonstrate 100 milliseconds latency or less

Deadlines

- For ongoing high-cost support:
 - o Request to waive speed testing is due by February 28 each year
 - o Customer list is due by April 30 annually (if no waiver is granted)
- For project-based grant support:
 - o Generally, speed testing must be completed within 30 days of project completion.
 - Additional testing may be required to be performed; see individual program guidelines.

Testing Intervals

- Any six consecutive hours between 7:00 a.m. and 12:00 a.m. Central Time
- Carriers may select the six-hour period to be tested, but must begin and conclude the testing during the allowable testing window.
- A minimum of one download test and one upload test per hour should be performed
- Tests should measure a connection between a specific consumer location and specific remote server location for a duration of at least 10 seconds.
- New in 2024: file-based testing may be performed.

Minimum Required Locations (New in 2024)

Number of locations in funded area	Number of test locations
5 or fewer	All locations in project area
6-50	5
51-500	10, or 10% of the total number of locations, whichever is greater
Over 500	50

Broadband Data Collection

- Carriers are expected to submit to the BDC data which aligns with speed testing required by the Nebraska Public Service Commission
- In the event there is a mismatch between submitted speed data and BDC data, additional testing may be required to be performed.
