Gene Hand reported that the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) released FCC 14-54 on June 10, 2014, an order entered on April 23, 2014. Discussion focused on paragraphs 87-89 addressing the waiver of study area boundaries below the exchange level. The FCC will waive the \$7,990 filing fee and seek comment on these waiver petitions; however, they will be deemed granted on the 60th day after the reply comment due date.

Gene Hand reported on comments made recently by FCC Chairman Thomas Wheeler expressing his views that state laws that ban or restrict communities from providing broadband should not exist and the FCC may use their powers to preempt state laws. Members of both the Senate and House have sent letters to Chairman Wheeler advocating the FCC should not attempt to usurp state policy with respect to municipal broadband.
