The purpose of this letter is to inform you that ALLO Communications intends to apply to the Nebraska Public Service Commission for a Capital Projects Fund grant to provide broadband internet service to North Ogallala, which includes Spruce and Highway 26 and South Lake McConaughy. We are seeking feedback from area leadership regarding the proposed project.

ALLO will provide broadband service to the project area through an all Fiber-to-the-Premise network.

Proposed Speed Tiers and Pricing:

ALLO provides ubiquitous 1+ Gbps service with symmetrical speeds (delivering the same download and upload speeds) to entities including residences, businesses, and government entities. The standard offerings are symmetrical speeds at 500 Mbps (\$69/month), and 1 Gbps (\$98/month).
