Earlier this year the “Telecommunications Act of 1996” had its tenth anniversary which is an example of how today’s regulatory environment has changed dramatically from the days of more than 50 years ago when I began my public service in Nebraska. The Public Service Commission brings stakeholders together to resolve concerns and problems. In the performance of this responsibility, the Commission serves as a liaison between state government represented by the executive and legislative branches, the telecommunications providers, and the public for which everything is done. While consumer complaints and quality of service issues continue to be a priority both Commissioners and staff are constantly investigating and evaluating new telecommunication services, equipment, and policies for possible impacts on the citizens of Nebraska.

This report highlights several aspects of the Public Service Commission’s efforts in telecommunications during the previous fiscal year. Inside, you will find descriptions of the recently completed broadband report. In addition, the Commission has exerted positive leadership nationally on number pooling and area code exhaust relief. Both of these items are important to Nebraskans.

Several significant developments have occurred in the telecommunications industry since our last report to you:

- ✓ The Federal Communications Commission approved Nebraska’s request for delegated authority to mandate that telecommunications carriers share numbering resources in all rate centers located in the 402 Area Code. I believe this additional authority will significantly extend the life of the 402 Area Code (page 26).
- ✓ Competitive Local Exchange Carriers as a group now serve more landline telephones than the state’s largest single Incumbent Local Exchange Carrier (page 1-3).
- ✓ The number of cell phones exceeded the number of landline telephones by the end of the fiscal year on June 30 with 54% of the market.
- ✓ Voice Over Internet Protocol (VoIP) phone service has become more commonplace and is available from both traditional regulated carriers and from “pure” VoIP unregulated providers (page 44).

- ✓ The Nebraska Internet Enhancement Fund completed its first round of projects and awarded \$247,275 to five applicants. Solicitations for new projects to extend broadband deployment to rural areas of the state have been requested (page 34).
- ✓ The Nebraska Telephone Assistance Program provides financial support for low-income Nebraskans to have telephone service. Currently 27,000 Nebraska customers are enrolled in this program, which reduces monthly phone bills by up to \$13.50 and also provides support with connection charges.
- ✓ The Nebraska Tele-Health Program provides funding to interconnect 68 rural and critical access hospitals across the state to hub hospitals in Grand Island, Kearney, Lincoln, Norfolk, North Platte, Omaha and Scottsbluff. This program works in conjunction with the Federal Telehealth Program and the Commission has allocated \$900,000 per year for this purpose.
- ✓ The monthly Nebraska Universal Service Fund surcharge was reduced from 6.95% to 5.75% effective October 1, 2005 (page 47).
- ✓ The Wireless E-911 program has begun funding the development of the databases necessary to support Phase II E-911 as well as continuing the implementation of Phase I technology in cooperation with county programs (page 51).
- ✓ The Nebraska Relay Service surcharge was reduced from seven cents per month per telephone line to five cents. The relay service makes it possible for Nebraskans with hearing and speech impairments to use telecommunications, and the service handled an average of 17,250 calls and 79,110 minutes per month. Several issues vital to the future of the relay system now are pending before the Federal Communications Commission and the Public Service Commission will continue to monitor these proposals and their possible impact on Nebraska.

The Public Service Commission urges you and your staff to review this 2006 Annual Telecommunications Report to the Legislature. If you or your staff have any questions, please call upon us for help.

On a personal note, I announced in January that I would not be seeking re-election to the Commission. The time I have spent in local affairs, with the Public Service Commission, and as a state senator in the Nebraska Legislature has been very satisfying. Thank you for your cooperation and the memories you have added to my years of service.

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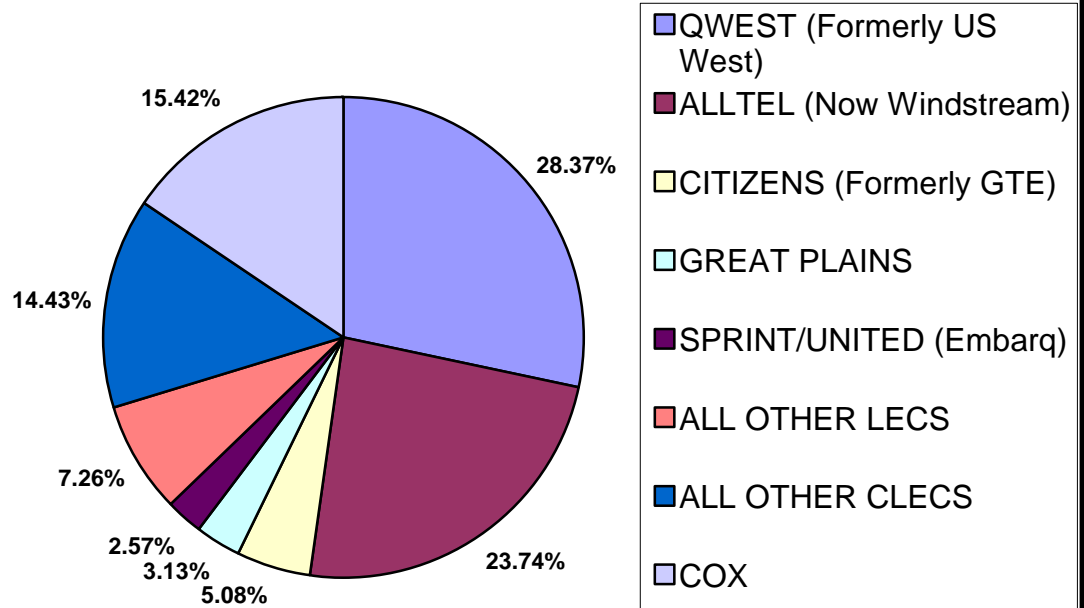

While the Commission lacks statutory authority over wireless telecommunications service and billing, it continues to receive a number of such complaints. The Commission strives, utilizing existing resources, to address these complaints to assist the wireless customer.

A. Local Exchange Carriers (LECs)

There are 45 incumbent local exchange carriers in Nebraska (including the cooperative telephone companies) and 100 competitive local exchange carriers. Qwest is the largest LEC with 274, 238 access lines. The following table shows the LEC complaints by company. The largest number of complaints involved the two largest LECs, Alltel and Qwest.

B. Interexchange Carriers (IXCs)

The number of long distance companies certificated to operate in the state continues to grow. Currently, there are 242 companies authorized to provide long distance services in Nebraska. The following table shows the number of complaints filed against long distance companies. The largest number of complaints involved AT&T and MCI. C. Departmental Complaints

The following departmental complaint is pending with the Commission:

DC-71/NUSF-53 Maurice Gene Hand, Director of the Communications Department of the Nebraska Public Service Commission and Jeffrey L. Pursley, Director of the Universal Service Fund Department of the Nebraska Public Service Commission v. Qwest Corporation.

On March 2, 2006, M. Gene Hand, Director of the Communications Department and Jeff Pursley, Director of the Universal Service Fund Department filed a complaint against Qwest alleging Qwest violated Commission rules and regulations by failing to provide adequate services to its telecommunications customers in the exchange serving Valentine, Nebraska and the surrounding area. A hearing was held on July 20, 2006, in Valentine, Nebraska. The parties requested an opportunity to file post-hearing briefs. A final order was entered on September 19, 2006, sustaining the complaint and issuing a compliance plan requiring Qwest to improve service in the Valentine Exchange.

D. Relay Service Complaints

Consumer complaints related to the relay system totaled 45 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006, as compared to 51 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005. Service complaints totaled eight during this period. Generally, noncompliances with relay policies or procedures by Communication Assistants comprise this category. Twenty-one complaints comprise the technical complaint category. Of the technical complaints, eight related to carrier of choice and six of those were attributed to CapTel customers. There were six 711-related issues. Most of these issues were related to Alltel switch translation problems that have been resolved. Of the total 45 complaints received, 16 were categorized as external complaints. These complaints typically reside outside of the direct control of the relay facility and consequently are not attributed to relay nonperformance. A large number of these complaints, with 11, are fraudulent/harassment calls through Internet Relay or another internet relay provider not affiliated with Hamilton. Generally, calls of this nature may also request the user to provide prepayments or fees for services or products that are not rendered. The five miscellaneous external complaints primarily involve customer equipment problems or disconnected numbers the customer has attempted to call. Unless noted otherwise, all complaints are deemed to relate to traditional (TTY/Voice) calls.

On March 7th, 2006 at 11:03 PM Central Time, the CapTel Communications Center in Madison, Wisconsin, experienced a service outage for approximately 45 minutes as a result of a sprinkler head bursting on the third floor, causing the fire alarms to activate. No critical call processing equipment was damaged. CapTel's overall service level was not affected, ending the day with 97% of all calls answered in 10 seconds. However, no CapTel calls were processed during the 45-minute evacuation period.

PART III

Review of the Availability of Diverse and Affordable Telecommunications Services to the People of Nebraska

1. Telecommunications Act of 1996

The Nebraska Public Service Commission implements key provisions of the 1996 Telecommunications Act (Act) that facilitate competition while maintaining quality and affordable service. Multiple factors contribute to increased consumer choice. First, competitive local exchange carriers (CLECs) create local competition. CLECs serve approximately 25 percent of the state's access lines, an increase from a 13 percent share two years ago. Cable providers, primarily in the Omaha and Lincoln areas, serve nearly half of the market share attributed to CLECs. Second, wireless companies continue to increase their presence, now accounting for over 42 percent of the combined wireline and wireless market and they are forecasted to exceed 50 percent during 2006. The additional choice has not reduced access. Ninety-seven percent of Nebraskans continue to possess basic telephone service.

During the previous year, the Commission addressed numerous issues involving consumer choice, service quality, safety, distance learning, universal service, and emergent technology such as VoIP (Voice over Internet Protocol). The list below includes some of the major issues addressed by the Commission in the last fiscal year:

C-2831/NUSF-51/PI-60 In the Matter of the Nebraska Public Service Commission, on its own motion, seeking to investigate telecommunications infrastructure development in Nebraska.

The Commission opened this docket in 2002 to investigate infrastructure development in Nebraska. The Commission surveyed carriers to determine the extent to which broadband services were being deployed. In January 2006, the Commission again surveyed the carriers to determine the extent of broadband deployment in the state. Carriers responded to the Commission's investigation in mid-March. In July, the staff released a broadband survey report. The survey report showed that 91 percent of incorporated places had broadband access from at least one provider. Fourteen incorporated places had five or more broadband providers. Copies of the survey were distributed to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and members of the Broadband Task Force. The survey report is also available on the Commission's website.

On August 22, 2006, the Commission held a workshop to develop a way to gather data on a more granular level and to better determine the extent of broadband deployment in unincorporated places. A subsequent survey has been released for carrier response and the Commission plans to release an updated report later this year.

C-3324 In the Matter of the Petition of N.E. Colorado Cellular, Inc., d/b/a Viaero Wireless, Fort Morgan, Colorado, for designation as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier under 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(2).

On December 23, 2004, N.E. Colorado Cellular Inc., d/b/a Viaero Wireless (Viaero) of Fort Morgan, Colorado, filed an application asking the Commission to designate it as an eligible telecommunications carrier pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(2). Viaero amended the application on May 2, 2005. A hearing was held on July 18, 19 and 20, 2005, in Lincoln and McCook. The Commission's decision was released on October 18, 2005, designating Viaero as an eligible telecommunications carrier eligible to receive federal universal service support.

C-3345 In the Matter of the Nebraska Public Service Commission, on its own motion, seeking to investigate Qwest's Switched Access Charge Rates.

Qwest Corporation filed a tariff to increase its intrastate-switched access rates in Nebraska. The Commission opened an investigation to determine whether the rates Qwest charged for switched access was reasonable. The Commission began its inquiry in February of 2005. The Commission held an oral argument to determine whether Qwest properly implemented the access rates by changing its rates in a tariff in light of the Commission's decisions regarding the Nebraska Universal Service Fund (NUSF), which reduced access rates for Qwest. The Commission staff, Qwest and the Interveners in the case developed a stipulated settlement and presented the stipulation to the Commission for review. The stipulation was approved allowing Qwest to slightly increase its access rates but not allowing Qwest to increase them to the extent filed in its tariff.

C-3469 In the Matter of the Application of Budget Phone, Inc., Shreveport, Louisiana, seeking Designation as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier (ETC) in the State of Nebraska.

On August 16, 2005, Budget Phone, Inc. (Budget) out of Shreveport, Louisiana, filed an application asking the Commission to designate it as an eligible telecommunications carrier pursuant to 47 U.S.C. Section 214(e)(2) of the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 (the Act). A number of rural telephone companies intervened in the case. Budget amended the application on January 26, 2006. The Act and FCC rules, regulations and orders offer some guidance for the designation process. The Commission reviews the application to determine whether the applicant will offer the supported services as defined by the FCC throughout the designated area and whether the applicant will sufficiently advertise its services throughout the area.

A hearing was held on Budget's application on January 31, 2006, in Lincoln. On February 22, 2006, the Commission approved Budget's request and designated Budget as an eligible telecommunications carrier.

C-3474 In the Matter of the Application of Sprint Nextel Corporation, Reston, Virginia, seeking approval of the transfer of control of United Telephone Company of the West, d/b/a Sprint, St. Paul, Minnesota, and Sprint Long Distance, Inc., Overland Park, Kansas, from Sprint Nextel Corporation to LTD Holding Company, Overland Park, Kansas.

On August 25, 2005, an application was filed by Sprint Nextel Corporation (Sprint Nextel), Overland Park, Kansas, requesting to transfer control of United Telephone Company of the West, d/b/a Sprint (United), St. Paul, Minnesota, and Sprint Long Distance, Inc. (Sprint LD), Overland Park, Kansas, to LTD Holding Company. The transaction was a separation of the wireline and wireless entities. The Commission approved the transfer of control on November 1, 2005. LTD Holding Company was a newly formed subsidiary of Sprint, which became a separate entity. Upon the separation, LTD Holding Company realized control of United and Sprint LD along with Sprint Nextel's other incumbent local exchange carrier operations. United subsequently changed its name to Embarq. Sprint Nextel remains as the wireless entity.

C-3480/NUSF-49 In the Matter of the Application of Mobius Communications Company, Hemingford, seeking designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier that may receive federal and state universal service support.

By application filed September 9, 2005, and amended December 30, 2005, Mobius Communications Company (Mobius), Hemingford, seeks designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) so that it may receive state and federal universal service support. Mobius seeks Nebraska eligible telecommunication carrier designation so that it can provide Nebraska Telephone Assistance Program (NTAP) assistance to its qualifying customers and so that it may receive high cost support for customers served via unbundled network elements leased from Qwest Corporation. After hearing on the application, the Commission designated Mobius as an eligible telecommunications carrier on March 7, 2006.

C-3497 In the Matter of the Application of Alltel Communications of Nebraska, Inc., Little Rock, Arkansas, seeking designation as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier Pursuant to Section 214(e)(2) of the Communications Act of 1934.

By Application filed October 21, 2005, Alltel Communications of Nebraska, Inc., Little Rock, Arkansas ("Alltel Wireless"), sought designation as a competitive eligible telecommunications carrier ("ETC") pursuant to Section 214(e)(2) of the Telecommunications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act"), 47 U.S.C. § 214(e)(2), and Section 54.201 of the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC") rules, 47 C.F.R. § 54.201. A hearing on the application was held on February 6, 2006, in Lincoln, Nebraska. On March 7, 2006, the Commission found Alltel Wireless had met the criteria requested to be designated as an eligible telecommunications carrier and granted the application.

C-3448/NUSF-46/PI-102 In the Matter of the Joint Petition of Allo Communications, LLC, Imperial; Mobius Communications Company, Hemingford; and Pinpoint Communications, Inc., Cambridge, for a docket to investigate findings and conclusions under C-2516 and NUSF-26 regarding competitive business telecommunications.

On July 15, 2005, Allo Communications, L.L.C., of Imperial, Mobius Communications Company, of Hemingford and Pinpoint Communications, Inc., of Cambridge, requested the Commission to investigate certain findings and conclusions made in Application No. C-2516 and NUSF-26 regarding competitive business telecommunications. It was agreed that the Commission would first focus its attention on the request for interim relief requested in the review of the Commission's decision in NUSF-26. The Commission then decided to address, at a later hearing, the request to modify Commission findings in Docket No. C-2516 relative to the wholesale UNE loop rates charged by Qwest in the three Commission-established zones.

On March 7, 2006, the Commission found that it should temporarily modify its NUSF-26 findings and conclusions relative to supporting business lines. The grandfathering provision contained in paragraph 30 of the Commission's findings in NUSF-26 was temporarily extended to include business lines in zones 2 and 3 that the Petitioners could demonstrate to the Commission's satisfaction were in service or were in the process of procuring service as a business line as of November 3, 2004, the date when the original order in NUSF-26 was entered. This temporary extension of the provisions of NUSF-26 is only in effect until the Commission has had an opportunity to investigate and make a determination on the alignment of NUSF-26 and Docket No. C-2516.

C-3520 In the Matter of the Application of SKT Ventures, Inc., Dalton Holdings, Inc. and Newcastle Holdings, Inc., Wichita, Kansas, seeking approval of changes of controlling interests in Elsie Communications, Inc. and Dalton Telephone Company, Inc., Wichita, Kansas.

On December 20, 2005, an application was filed by SKT Ventures, Inc. (SKT), Wichita, Kansas, Dalton Holdings, Inc. (DHI), Wichita, Kansas, and Newcastle Holdings, Inc. (NHI), Charlotte, North Carolina, (Applicants) seeking approval of changes of controlling interest in Elsie and Dalton telephone exchanges. SKT and DHI each owned controlling interest in the Elsie and Dalton telephone exchanges respectively. Both SKT and DHI agreed to sell 100% of their controlling stock interest to NHI.

The Commission considered whether the change of control served the public interest by analyzing the impact on consumers in the Elsie and Dalton exchanges. On March 14, 2006, the Commission approved the transfer of control from SKT and DHI to NHI. As part of the transfer, NHI and its affiliate American Broadband Communications (ABB) sent informational letters about the Stock Purchase and the change in controlling interests to all Elsie and Dalton customers and held public meetings in Dalton on May 17, 2006, and in Elsie on May 18, 2006, to allow the public to meet the new owners and ask questions.

C-3521 In the Matter of the Application of HunTel Systems, Inc., Blair, Noble Holdings, Inc. and American Broadband Capital, Inc., Charlotte, North Carolina, seeking approval of changes of controlling interests in Arlington Telephone Company, The Blair Telephone Company, Eastern Nebraska Telephone Company, Rock County Telephone Company and HunTel Cablevision, Inc. d/b/a HunTel Communications, Blair.

On December 20, 2005, HunTel Systems, Inc., of Blair, Noble Holdings, Inc. and American Broadband Capital, (ABB) Inc., of Charlotte, North Carolina, filed an application seeking approval of a change of controlling interest in Arlington Telephone Company, The Blair Telephone Company, Eastern Nebraska Telephone Company, Rock County Telephone Company and HunTel Cablevision, Inc. d/b/a HunTel Communications, all of Blair.

On December 19, 2005, Noble and ABB entered into a Stock Purchase Agreement with HunTel pursuant to which HunTel agreed to sell to Noble and ABB and Noble and ABB agreed to purchase from HunTel all of the issued and outstanding shares of capital stock of the certificated carriers. On March 14, 2006, the Commission approved the change of controlling interest.

C-3535 In the Matter of the Nebraska Public Service Commission, on its own motion, seeking to establish procedures for the treatment of commercial agreements not subject to the filing requirements of § 252 of the Telecommunications Act of 1996.

On January 18, 2006, the Commission opened an investigation to establish procedures for the treatment of commercial agreements not subject to the filing requirements of § 252 of the Telecommunications Act of 1996.

In August of 2003, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) issued its Triennial Review Order that shortened the list of unbundled network elements (UNEs) incumbent local exchange carriers (ILECs) were required to make available to competitive local exchange carriers (CLECs). *In the matter of Review of the Section 251 Unbundling Obligations of Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers; Implementation of the Local Competition Provisions of the Telecommunications Act of 1996; Deployment of Wireline Services Offering Advanced Telecommunications Capability*, CC Docket Nos. 01-338, 96-98, 98-147, Report and Order on Remand and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, 18 FCC Rcd 16978 (Triennial Review Order). On February 4, 2005 the FCC released its latest list of elements in the Triennial Review Order on Remand (TRRO), further limiting the elements subject to mandatory unbundling. *In the Matter of Unbundled Access to Network Elements*, WC Docket No. 04-313.

In addition in September of 2005, the Federal Communications Commission partially granted a petition of Qwest Communications seeking forbearance of certain unbundling obligations in the Omaha Metropolitan Area. *See In the Matter of the Petition of Qwest Corporation for Forbearance pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 160(c) in the Omaha Metropolitan Statistical Area*, WC Docket No. 04-223, Memorandum Opinion and Order, 2005 WL 3287482 (September 16, 2005)(Omaha Forbearance Order).

The Commission's investigation focuses on the filing of commercial agreements that no longer have to be approved due to the FCC's Triennial Review Remand Order and the Omaha Forbearance Order. The Commission has received comments and reply comments and is deciding whether a hearing is necessary to make a determination in this investigation.

C-3545 In the Matter of the Joint Application of ALLTEL Nebraska Inc., ALLTEL Communications of the Midwest, Inc. and ALLTEL Systems of the Midwest, Inc., each of Lincoln, for Authority to Issue Collateralized Guaranties of Long-Term Indebtedness.

ALLTEL Nebraska Inc., ALLTEL Communications of the Midwest and ALLTEL Systems of the Midwest, Inc. (collectively referred to as Alltel), Lincoln, filed an application on January 24, 2006, seeking authority to issue collateralized guaranties of long-term indebtedness.

On April 14, 2006, Alltel filed a motion to withdraw the application for authority to issue collateralized guaranties of long-term indebtedness stating the "guarantees and liens by the regulated entities are no longer required." On April 18, 2006, the Commission found the motion to withdraw the application should be granted. The Commission later approved the applications of ALLTEL Nebraska Inc., ALLTEL Communications of the Midwest and ALLTEL Systems of the Midwest, Inc. to change their names to Windstream Nebraska Inc., Windstream Communications of the Midwest and Windstream Systems of the Midwest, Inc.

C-3554/PI-112 In the Matter of the Commission, on its own motion, seeking to investigate whether the zones established in Docket No. C-2516 are appropriate in light of NUSF-26 findings and conclusions.

On February 28, 2006, the Commission opened an investigation to reevaluate the zoning scheme used to determine the unbundled element network loop (UNE-L) rates set out in Docket No. C-2516 in light of Nebraska Universal Service Fund (NUSF) Department Order NUSF-26 findings and conclusions.

Commission staff proposed modifying the zones and proposed a Unifying Method (UM) to modify the UNE-L rates effective as a result of Application No. C-2516 and to develop rates consistent with the support areas determined in NUSF-26. The UM determines UNE-L rates for in-town and out-of-town areas, as defined in NUSF-26 and would result in splitting each of the current zones into two support areas.

Comments on the UM were due on March 28, 2006. A Commission decision has been delayed pending the outcome on docket's affecting the Nebraska Universal Service Fund and UNE rates.

2. Local Competition

A. Competitive Local Exchange Carriers

The following companies received new authority during the 2005-2006 fiscal year to provide local service in the corresponding territories in Nebraska:

There are currently 145 carriers that have received Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide competitive local exchange services in Nebraska; however, not all carriers are currently offering local service in Nebraska.

B. Interconnection Agreements

Under the Telecommunications Act of 1996, a company wanting to compete with a local exchange carrier (LEC) needs to enter into an interconnection agreement with the LEC in whose territory it wishes to offer service. A company may reach an interconnection agreement with a LEC in one of three ways: 1) It may voluntarily negotiate an interconnection agreement; 2) Request adoption of a Commission-approved interconnection agreement in accordance with Section 252(i) of the Act; or 3) Ask for mediation or arbitration if voluntary negotiations are not successful at reaching a mutually-acceptable interconnection agreement. All interconnection agreements that have been approved by the Commission can be found on the Commission's website at <http://www.psc.state.ne.us>. The agreements are divided into the following three categories: 1) Voluntarily-negotiated; 2) Section 252(i) interconnection agreements; and 3) Arbitrated.

3. Service Testing & Outage Report

The Commission ensures Nebraskans are receiving quality telecommunications service by periodically reviewing performance data provided by telephone companies and by monitoring consumer complaints for indications of potential problems requiring further investigation. All local exchange carriers are using digital switches designed to perform a series of self-diagnostic tests, which makes the monitoring and identification of service quality issues much easier. The Commission's technical staff offers assistance in identifying the source of service problems and is available to assist in resolving service complaints from consumers across the state.

The current service quality standards in the Commission's Telecommunications Rules and Regulations were developed for traditional copper based switched circuit technology. The Commission Staff is conducting the final review of the existing service quality rules and will propose changes intended to be technology neutral.

Reports are required to be filed with the Commission by local exchange carriers when service outages are experienced. The report provides the date and time of the outage, the geographic area affected, the cause of the outage, if known, and an estimate of the access lines affected. Within five days, a final report is filed showing the number of customer trouble reports received related to the outage and the corrective action taken. The following tables show the number of service outages and by type, as well as the total number of outages and access lines affected during the past ten years.

4. Telecommunications Relay Services

Telecommunications Relay Services (“TRS”) enables a person with a hearing or speech impairment to engage in wireline or wireless communication with a hearing person in a manner that is functionally equivalent to someone without such a disability. TRS facilitates two-way communication between an individual who uses a text telephone (“TTY”) or other nonvoice terminal device and an individual who does not have such a device. Communications Assistants (“CAs”) transmit (“Relay”) written communication from a text telephone or other nonvoice terminal device to a person using a standard telephone. The person using the standard telephone speaks to the CA who transmits the message to the hearing impaired individual. The relay is funded through a monthly surcharge on all access lines, including voice-based wireless lines. The monthly surcharge was 10 cents per access line in 1993 and 1994. It was seven cents in 1995, 1996 and 1997. In 1998 the surcharge was reduced to six cents, and it was reduced to five cents for the years 1999 through 2001. In 2002 and 2003, the surcharge increased to six cents and seven cents, respectively. LB 530 which became law during the 2003 Legislative Session changed the date of the public hearing to determine the annual surcharge from October 1 to April 1 of each year. This bill also changed the effective date of the annual surcharge from January 1 to July 1. For July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2006, the surcharge remained at seven cents. The surcharge was reduced to five cents for the July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007 fiscal year.

The definition of TRS extends to speech-to-speech (“STS”), video relay services (“VRS”), Internet Protocol (“IP”) and non-English language relay services (Spanish-to-Spanish). STS and non-English language relay services (Spanish-to-Spanish) were mandated by CC Docket 98-67, FCC 00-56, *In the Matter of Telecommunications Relay Services and Speech-to-Speech Services for Individuals with Hearing and Speech Disabilities*, (See also *Order On Reconsideration* CC Docket 98-67, FCC 00-200, released June 5, 2000. This order amended the effective dates for compliance with most of the amended rules adopted in the TRS Order).

In 1995, the Legislature created the Nebraska Equipment Distribution Program, which enables qualifying deaf, hard-of-hearing and/or speech-impaired citizens, to obtain specialized telecommunications equipment at no expense, subject to certain program restrictions. Funded by the Relay Surcharge, telecommunications equipment, such as text telephones, amplifiers, signaling devices and speech-generating devices have been made available to deaf, hard-of-hearing and/or speech-impaired consumers. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006, \$322,060 was expended in the program as compared to \$368,569 for the previous period. Households served in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006 total 877 as compared to 950 for the previous period. Cumulative expenditures total \$1,866,889 since the equipment program began in April 1996.

Summary of Significant Issues Impacting TRS

State Level

1) **Internet Protocol (IP) and Video Relay Services (VRS).**

Hamilton currently offers Internet relay as a 24-hour service that allows computers and other web-based devices to connect to the relay center via the Internet to call any standard telephone user, VCO or HCO user. This access is accomplished by going to Hamilton's relay website at www.hiprelay.com to place a relay call. The CA workstation makes an internet connection to the requesting user and the call is processed just like any other inbound text relay call. Since there is no current method to determine where the Internet call originated from, all Internet relay calls are placed free of charge to the originating caller. Currently, the Interstate TRS fund is paying for all Internet-enabled relay minutes.

Hamilton Video Relay Service (www.hipvrs.com) is available to individuals with a hearing and/or speech disability, who use a combination of sign language and/or speech to make use of video equipment and high speed internet access in order to communicate with voice telephone users. Hamilton provides VRS in conjunction with Birnbaum Interpreting Services (BIS). An interpreter at the relay center answers the call and communicates in sign language with the caller. The interpreter will relay the call by translating the calling party's sign language into voice for the called party. The relay calls will then be translated from voice to sign language. The user will reach the video relay system via the Internet.

Individuals can place a video relay call in either of two ways: 1) by using a videophone, high speed internet connection and a television; or by 2) using a computer and a webcam. Simply dial call.hipvrs.com into a videophone, such as a D-Link DVC-1000, to connect with a HIP VRS interpreter. If you use option 2, you will go to www.hipvrs.com to reach a HIP VRS interpreter.

Hamilton will distribute D-Link video conferencing equipment to deaf/hard of hearing individuals. The D-Link turns any TV into a broadband videophone. It sits on top the TV and contains a video camera. To qualify and receive a free D-Link from Hamilton one needs to have the following:

- Broadband internet connection (256 kbps or faster upload and download). To find out how fast an internet connection is, go to <http://www.dslreports.com/stest>;
- A television or RF Modulator that has video and audio jacks;
- No firewall. One can only use HIP VRS behind a firewall if the firewall is aware of H.323 compatible software such as the D-Link;
- A router is needed if the ISP is only providing one IP address and someone would like to have multiple devices connected to the internet, i.e., a computer.

Once a person receives a D-Link videophone, the user can follow Hamilton's interactive web-based instructions for installation by going to www.hipvrs.com and click on "D-Link Instructions" or go directly to www.hipvrs.com/d-link.

2) **Effective December 1, 2005 Nebraska Relay began providing 2-Line *CapTel* service.** The user must purchase a second (analog) line to use this service. There are several benefits to using 2-Line *CapTel* over single line *CapTel* including:

- Dialing 9-1-1 directly, and use *CapTel* as intended. Avoids changing to using Voice Carry Over, VCO;
- Friends and family can dial the direct number directly rather than dialing a toll-free number;
- Captions can be turned on or off as needed at any time during a call and;
- If there is more than one telephone extension in the home, other family members can participate in a joint conversation.

The relay statistics table following the end of this section includes *CapTel* conversation minutes, monthly service cost for providing *CapTel* and the expenditures incurred for the Equipment Distribution Program for *CapTel* equipment.

Summary of Significant Issues Impacting Telecommunications Relay Services

Federal Level

A number of issues impacting CG (“Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau”) Docket No. 03-123 (“*Telecommunications Relay Services and Speech-to-Speech Services for Individuals with Hearing and Speech Disabilities*”) are as follows:

- 1) *Further Notice Of Proposed Rulemaking* (released June 30, 2004) is still outstanding by the FCC and addresses a number of issues including: 1) the appropriate cost recovery methodology for VRS; 2) what type of mechanism should be used to determine which IP Relay and VRS calls are interstate and intrastate; 3) whether or not IP Relay and/or VRS should become mandatory forms of TRS; 4) whether IP Relay and/or VRS should be required to be offered 7 days a week, 24 hours a day.
- 2) On May 8, 2006, a *Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* was released addressing the misuse of Internet Protocol (IP) and Video Relay Service (VRS). The Federal Communications Commission is seeking comment on how to remedy their misuse. Comments were due by July 3, 2006, with Reply comments due by July 17. IP is a form of text-based TRS in which a user connects to the TRS facility via the Internet using a computer, web phone, personal digital assistant (PDA), or any other IP-capable device. VRS is a form of relay service that requires a broadband Internet connection between the VRS user and the CA, which facilitates communication in ASL via a video link.

A common misuse of IP relay involves a hearing user defrauding merchants by making purchases over the telephone using stolen, fake, or otherwise invalid credit cards, and to make harassing or “prank” calls. Since the CA receives no identifying information on the inbound call, a high degree of anonymity results. Misuse of VRS as a substitute for an In-Person Interpreter or a Video Remote Interpreting (VRI) service is another concern the FCC addresses in this notice.

For both types of relay service, the FCC seeks comment on a variety of issues including: 1) whether the relay provider or CA should be given discretion to determine the legitimacy of calls; 2) if user registration could be utilized to prevent misuse; 3) safeguarding consumer’s rights. For IP relay, the FCC seeks comment on whether to waive or modify certain TRS rules to screen and terminate IP calls that may be deemed to be fraudulent.

- 3) On May 9, 2006 a *Declaratory Ruling and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* regarding Video Relay Service interoperability was issued. The declaratory ruling provides that a VRS provider must ensure that their

network allows all VRS consumers to place and receive calls in order to receive compensation from the Interstate TRS Fund.

The Further Notice seeks comment on how an open and global database of proxy numbers can be created so that when a hearing user calls a VRS user, he does not first have to obtain the VRS user's current IP address. This notice also seeks comment on what Internet protocols or standards may be needed to ensure efficient call handling among all VRS providers.

- 4) On May 31, 2006 the Consumer & Governmental Affairs Bureau reminded states and Telecommunications Relay Services providers that they must submit their annual consumer complaint log summaries for the 12-month period ending May 31, 2006, on or before July 3, 2006. The FCC requires state TRS programs to maintain a log of consumer complaints that allege violations of the federal TRS mandatory minimum standards. The Public Service Commission satisfied this requirement on June 15, 2006. A copy of this complaint summary is available by contacting the PSC or accessing the FCC's website.
- 5) On June 16, 2006, this *Order* addresses two issues concerning VRS service; 1) if the VRS CA and calling party are not communicating effectively, the 10-minute in-call replacement rule does not apply and another CA may be substituted and 2) the VRS CA may ask the user questions during call set-up if necessary to enable the call to be properly handled.
- 6) On the June 29, 2006 *Order*, the following per minute compensation rates were approved for the various forms of relay service for the period July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007; 1) \$1.291 for interstate traditional relay (TTY); 2) \$1.409 for interstate STS and 3) \$1.293 for interstate and intrastate IP relay. Concerning interstate and intrastate VRS, this Order freezes the compensation rate to \$6.644 per minute for a one-year period ending June 30, 2007 or until new cost recovery rules can be implemented, whichever is sooner.
- 7) On a *Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* July 13, 2006 the FCC sought comment on a broad range of issues concerning TRS compensation. Specifically, the FCC seeks comment on the following;
 - Alternative cost recovery methodologies for traditional TRS, STS and IP Relay;
 - The appropriate cost recovery mechanism and duration for VRS;
 - Issues relating to determining "reasonable" costs and to what extent certain costs, such as indirect, marketing, overhead, outreach should be compensated from the fund; Issues relating to continued administration of the fund and criteria for measuring performance and efficiencies.

5. Extended Area Service

Extended Area Service (EAS) allows customers in one exchange to place calls to, and receive calls from another exchange, without paying additional long distance charges. The key points of the basic rules and regulations established by the Commission relating to EAS are:

- * A petition seeking to establish EAS must contain the signatures of either 750 or 25 percent of the customers of the exchange whichever is less.
- * To determine if sufficient traffic exists to establish EAS, certain traffic criteria must be met in at least two of the three most recent months for which data is available.
- *! A telephone company may file an Optional Enhanced Area Calling Plan (OEACP) as an alternative to EAS.
- * If the minimum required signatures are obtained, and there is sufficient traffic to meet the requirements, informational meetings must be held in the petitioning exchange to inform the public of the proposed rates for EAS and to assess the public's interest in receiving EAS.
- * Following an unsuccessful attempt at implementing EAS, at least 12 months must lapse before additional attempts for EAS are made.
- * When put to a vote, EAS must receive the support of more than 50 percent of the customers in an exchange who vote.

There were no EAS applications made during fiscal year 2006 and currently there are no pending EAS applications.

6. Numbering Issues Area Code Conservation Efforts

In May of 1999, the Commission received information from the North American Number Plan Administrator that the number of assignable prefixes (otherwise known as central office NXX codes) available for area code 402 were in danger of being depleted in less than two years. The 402 area code covers the eastern third of the state and includes the cities of Omaha, Bellevue and Lincoln.

The Commission opened a public investigation and determined that employing number conservation methods could significantly delay the need for area code relief measures. Possible area code relief measures are boundary changes, splitting an area code, or introducing a new area code overlaid on an existing area code. In September of 1999, the Commission filed a petition with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) requesting authority to implement area code conservation methods within Nebraska, with special attention on the 402 area code. Specifically, the Commission requested authority for thousands-block number pooling, reclaiming unused central office codes, auditing number assignments, and reviewing distribution activities of service providers. Thousands-block number pooling allows telecommunications carriers that require new numbering resources to receive numbers in blocks of 1,000, rather than an entire central office code, which contains a block of 10,000 numbers.

On July 20, 2000, the FCC released an order granting the Commission's petition. The Commission set July 1, 2001, as the deadline for implementation of thousands-block number pooling in the Omaha MSA rate center. The cumulative effect of the conservation measures, and the voluntary efforts of the telecommunications carriers in Nebraska, resulted in extending the forecasted exhaust date for numbering resources in the 402 area code from the second quarter of 2001 to the first quarter of 2004.

On a national level the FCC set November 24, 2003, as the date at which all wireless carriers must be capable of supporting thousands-block pooling regardless of the geographical area served. The FCC also set May 24, 2004, as the date at which all wireline carriers serving rate centers in the top 100 MSAs must be capable of supporting thousands-block number pooling and local number portability. The only Nebraska MSA in the top 100 is Omaha-Council Bluffs. The effect of these pooling requirements, combined with continued efforts at the state level, resulted in a new forecast being issued in June of 2004, setting the forecasted exhaust date for the 402 area code at the second quarter of 2006.

The national Pooling Administrator has in place all necessary tools and processes to enable thousands-block pooling by carriers within the same rate center in both the 308 and 402 area codes. At the request of the Commission, the Pooling Administrator has classified all Nebraska rate centers as voluntary pooling capable. This allows any capable carrier to donate to, or use numbering resources from, the thousands-block number resource pool instead of opening a new central office code of 10,000 numbers.

On November 13, 2003, the Commission opened Docket No. C-3049 to conduct an investigation of various proposed solutions for extending the life of area codes 308 and 402. The Commission held hearings and workshops while staff worked with various industry groups to identify and evaluate alternative methods that could extend the life of the numbering resources in Nebraska. It was the conclusion of the workshop that while alternate methods of implementing thousands-blocks numbering resources were technically feasible, there were significant unresolved issues related to the routing of calls and appropriate carrier compensation.

There are two primary methods of extending the life of numbering resources in an area code; thousands-block number pooling and rate-center consolidation. Both techniques can be applied on a rate-center-by-rate-center basis to achieve specific objectives.

Thousands Block Number Pooling

As part of the efforts under Docket No. C-3049, the Commission requested the North American Numbering Plan Administrator to conduct a pro forma evaluation of the impact of mandatory pooling on the forecasted exhaust date for Area Code 402. The evaluation considered only those exchanges in which there are currently two or more carriers. The evaluation indicated that mandatory pooling could move the forecasted exhaust date for area code 402 from the second quarter of 2006 to the third quarter of 2010.

Under the current rules and regulations the implementation of mandatory pooling can occur only if the FCC issues specific authority to Nebraska. On November 11, 2004, Nebraska submitted a petition to the FCC for delegated authority to implement mandatory thousands-block number pooling in selected rate centers within the 402 area code. Seven other states submitted similar petitions and all comments submitted to the FCC were in support of the petitions.

On February 24, 2006, the FCC released “ORDER AND FIFTH FURTHER NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING”, granting Nebraska’s petition for authority to implement mandatory thousands-block number pooling in the 402 area code. The Commission has used the authority granted to implement mandatory pooling in two steps.

On March 14, 2006 the Commission issued an order under Docket No. C-3049 implementing mandatory pooling in the rate centers served by Alltel (now Windstream Communications), Qwest, and Frontier Communications (Citizens). Because these three carriers had been voluntarily participating in thousands block pooling they were able to make the transition from voluntary pooling to mandatory pooling in the 155 rate centers they serve without any delay.

On May 3, 2006 the Commission conducted a workshop during which the NeuStar Pooling Administrator provided the remaining carriers in the 402 Area Code with information concerning the steps and the typical time-line used when a rate center

changes from voluntary pooling to mandatory pooling. Carriers were asked to review the proposed time-line and provide feedback to the Commission by May 22, 2006. The Commission held a hearing on June 1, 2006, and sought comments on the prospect of designating all rate centers in the 402 area code as mandatory and a proposed implementation schedule for mandatory pooling of the remaining 94 rate centers. No parties submitted comments or testimony against designating the remaining 94 rate centers as mandatory or proposed an alternate implementation date.

On June 27, 2006, the Commission issued an order under Docket No. C-3049 implementing mandatory pooling in the remaining 94 rate centers effective November 1, 2006. Two carriers, Great Plains Communications, Inc. and Northeast Nebraska Telephone Company are in the process of upgrading switch platforms and have requested a waiver of the November 1, 2006 implementation date. Great Plains can meet the November 1, 2006 commitment for 19 rate centers, however they requested a waiver for the remaining 14 rate centers with a scheduled implementation plan that will have mandatory pooling implemented in all of their exchanges by March 31, 2008. Northeast requested a waiver until December 31, 2006, for implementation of mandatory pooling in their rate centers.

One of the advantages to having all rate centers in the 402 Area Code designated mandatory pooling would be that any carrier requesting numbering resources would have to obtain them at the thousands-block level through the Pooling Administrator. The Pooling Administrator will assign a thousands-block from the existing pool or open a full code to populate the pool. Only the needed blocks will be assigned leaving the remaining resources in the pool available for additional carriers.

The North American Numbering Plan Administration reports indicate the following status of Nebraska's numbering resources as of August 1, 2006.

The Pooling Administrator estimates that 16 full NPA-NXX codes in area code 308 have been saved since the first thousands-blocks were donated in April 25, 2003, and 42 full NPA-NXX codes in area code 402 have been saved by thousands-block number pooling since the first thousands-blocks were donated to the pool on October 31, 2001.

The cumulative effect of the proactive conservation measures taken by the Commission has resulted in the North American Numbering Plan Administrator extending the forecasted exhaust date for the 402 area code from the fourth quarter of 2006, reported last year, to the second quarter of 2008. This is considered to be a conservative forecast because the full impact of mandatory pooling has not yet been seen. The forecasted exhaust date for the 308 area code has been extended from the second quarter of 2026 to the third quarter of 2026. However, with the advent of new technologies such as Voice over Internet Protocol, free Voice Mail services, and the unknown demand upon numbering resources, forecasted exhaust dates remain very dynamic.

The Commission believes that the number conservation measures it has taken in the 402 area code have been successful in delaying the need for costly and potentially confusing area code relief measures. The Commission will continue to seek out and implement number conservation methods and procedures, and will encourage voluntary cooperation, including implementing number pooling, by telecommunications carriers operating in the 308 area code. These steps should extend the life of Nebraska's two area codes and delay the substantial cost to the industry and ratepayers associated with any area code relief plan.

Rate Center Consolidation

On July 12, 2005, Qwest proposed to the Commission to merge the Gretna, Elkhorn, and Omaha rate centers into one consolidated rate center at Omaha. The Commission opened Application No. C-3447/PI-101 to solicit input on the proposed rate center consolidation. This type of action enables existing numbering resources to be used over a larger geographic area providing significant expansion capability without using new central office codes. The Commission approved the proposed rate center consolidation on August 30, 2005. The consolidation of Gretna and Elkhorn into the Omaha rate centers was implemented on July 20, 2006.

Prior to the consolidation of the Gretna and Elkhorn rate centers with the Omaha rate center, the December, 2005, National Resource Utilization and Forecast (NRUF) data indicated a total of 117,000 telephone numbers were allocated to all carriers for use only in the Gretna/Elkhorn area. Of these 117,000, only 21,119 (or 18%) were assigned to working numbers; 2,082 were in transition or for administrative use, leaving 93,799 numbers unassigned. With the rate center consolidation, those 93,799 numbers are available for use across the entire Omaha rate center. This could potentially save seven to nine full codes in the 402 area code.

7. N11 Dialing Codes

Background

The FCC designated various three-digit dialing, or “N11,” codes for specific purposes in CC Docket No. 92-105, *In the Matter of the Use of N11 Codes and Other Abbreviated Dialing Arrangements*. State commissions, in turn, are delegated the responsibility of implementing the assigned dialing codes. Nebraska has assigned the use of “211,” “511” and “711.” By tradition 911 has been reserved for access to emergency services, typically through a Public Service Answering Point (PSAP). For each code, carriers seeking cost recovery are required to make an application to the Commission for reimbursement. To date, no carriers have applied for cost recovery.

Specific information on the n11 dialing codes implanted in Nebraska is provided in the following sections.

211 Dialing Code

The Commission assigned “211” to United Way of the Midlands for access to “First Call for Help.” First Call for Help connects people in need of health and human services assistance with the appropriate providers of such services. Dialing “211” does not result in any additional telephone charges for the consumer.

Current Status

United Way continues to expand the availability of First Call For Help to the citizens of Nebraska through 211. The current status of 211 Access is shown in the following table:

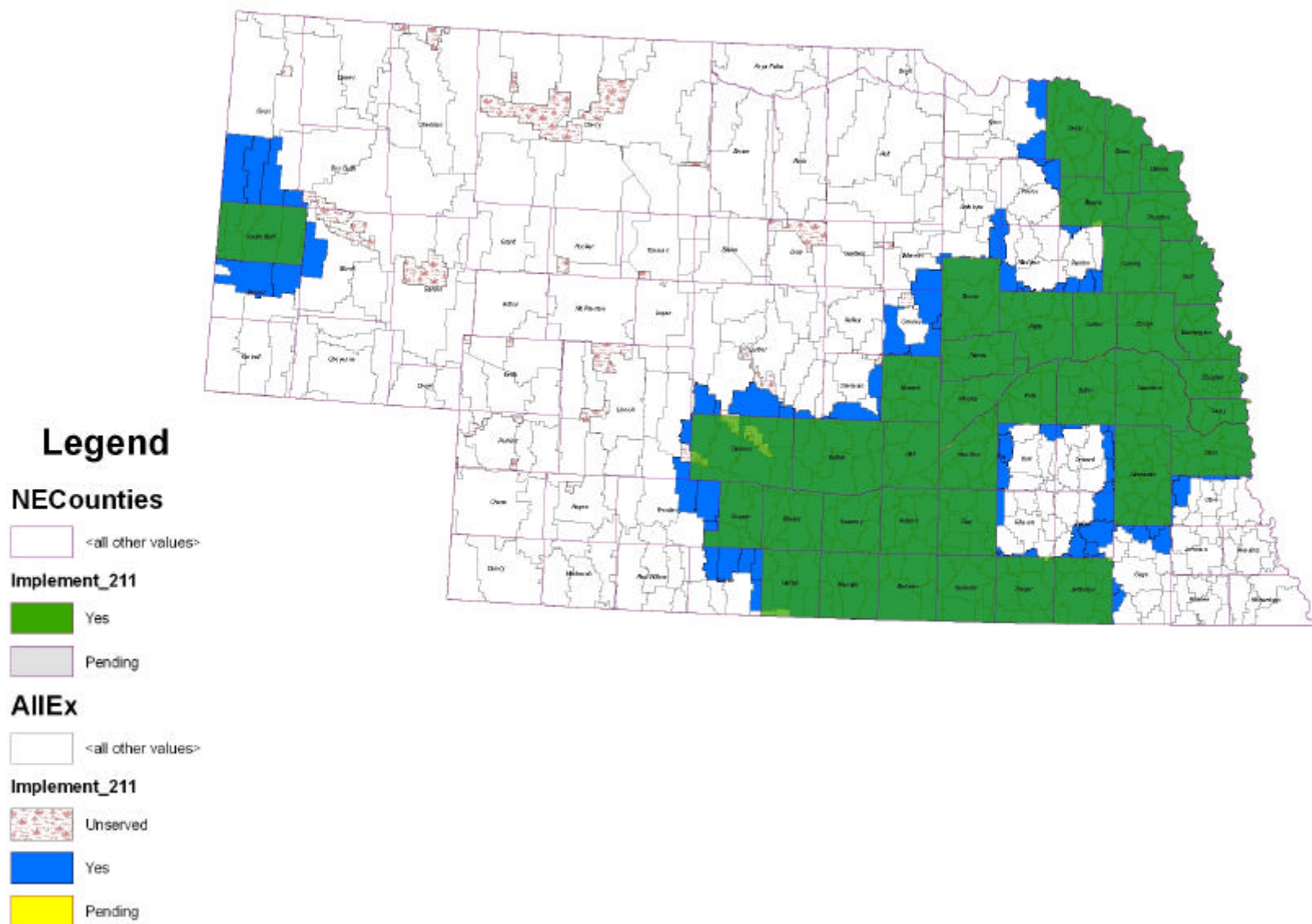

Currently 38 Nebraska counties have entered into an agreement with United Way of the Midlands to provide service through 211. Based on the 2004 Census figures, approximately 79% of Nebraskan residents can reach United Way of the Midlands by dialing 211.

The following map shows the current status of 211 in Nebraska:

311 Dialing Code

311 is the nationally assigned access code for non-emergency police and government services and has not been implemented in Nebraska at this time.

411 Dialing Code

411 is the nationally assigned access code to local directory services. When a consumer dials 411 they will be connected with the directory services group for their service provider (local exchange carrier, wireless carrier, or if a 1+ is dialed first their long distance carrier). Charges may be incurred for use of these services and are established by tariff filings with the Commission for local and long distance carriers.

511 Dialing Code

Weather reports and route specific road conditions can be obtained 24 hours a day for interstate and state highways throughout Nebraska by dialing 511 from any telephone in Nebraska. There is no charge to callers. The Nebraska State Patrol and Department of Roads manage this program.

611 Dialing Code

611 is assigned nationally as the access code to a carriers repair service organization.

711 Dialing Code

In CC Docket No. 92-105, *In the Matter of the Use of N11 Codes and Other Abbreviated Dialing Arrangements* the FCC designated 711 as the dialing for access to all telecommunication relay services (TRS). The Nebraska Public Service Commission opened Application No. C-2417 to examine issues related to the implementation of three-digit, 711, for access to all telecommunication relay services (TRS) in Nebraska. The FCC order further established an October 1, 2001 deadline for all telecommunications carriers, including wireline, wireless, PBX and payphone providers. On January 9, 2001 the Commission approved Docket No. C-2417 and established June 29, 2001 as the implementation deadline for 711.

The Nebraska Relay Service is designed to enable persons who are Deaf, Hard of Hearing, or Speech Disabled to communicate on the telephone with the general public.

The current status of the Nebraska Relay Service can be found in Part III, Section 4 of this report.

811 Dialing Code

Nebraska statute (§76-2301 – 76-2330) established the One-Call Notification System Act for the purpose of preventing injury to persons and damage to property and the interruption of utility services resulting from accidents caused by damage to underground

facilities. Since 1995 Diggers Hotline has been the link between people who want to excavate and the underground facility owner/operators. Access to the Diggers Hotline center, located in Omaha, has been through either the local number (402) 344-3565 or the toll free number (800) 331-5666. The State Fire Marshal's Office is the oversight organization for the One-Call Notification System.

On March 14, 2005, under the Sixth Report and Order in CC Docket No. 92-105, *In the Matter of the Use of N11 Codes and Other Abbreviated Dialing Arrangements*, the FCC designated 811 as the national abbreviated code to be used by states and delegated the authority to states to address the technical and operational issues associated with the implementation of the 811 code. This national abbreviated code will not change the numbers currently used to access the One-Call Notification System – it will simply provide an easily recognized n11 code to establish the connection to the One-Call Notification System. Per the FCC order 811 must be implemented by April 13, 2007.

The Commission will be working with the One-Call Notification System, State Fire Marshals Office, and the telecommunications carriers serving Nebraska in the implementation of this code.

911 Dialing Code

911 is the nationally designated access code to Emergency Services. Detailed information on the state of 911 in Nebraska is found in Part VIII, Section 2, of this report.

8. Nebraska Internet Enhancement Fund

The Nebraska Internet Enhancement Fund (NIEF) successfully completed the first round of grants awarded in January of 2005. NIEF was established by the Legislature to provide financial assistance to install and deliver broadband or other advanced telecommunications infrastructure and service throughout the state. Five grants were awarded in the initial round of grants under NIEF and all five grant projects were successfully completed by the spring of 2006.

The Commission staff, with the assistance of the NIEF Advisory Board, evaluated the initial grant awards and projects and solicited feedback and comment for grant recipients in preparation to open another grant period. The Pre-Application period opened on June 1, 2006. Selected Pre-Applicants were invited to submit full applications for funding by November 15, 2006. The Commission hopes to award the second round of grants under the NIEF program in January of 2007.

PART IV

Review of the Level of Rates of Local Exchange And Interexchange Companies

This section of the report provides current local rates and historical information on local rate changes of carriers, in addition to discussing some changes that are taking place in the long distance market. Due to the introduction of competition in some local exchanges, financial information – specifically the financial status of local exchange companies, has been omitted from this report.

1. Local Exchange Rates

The Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers (ILECs) operating in the State set their local rates at or near the Commission's target rates established in a 1999 order requiring rate rebalancing of local, long distance, and access charges. The Commission set \$17.50 for the residential rate and \$27.50 for the business rate under this plan. Any carriers not charging these rates applied for exemptions from the provisions of the order. Under the Commission's plan, any increase from local revenues was offset by a corresponding decrease in access charges. Should a company need an increase above these rate levels, statutory provisions provide a method where increases would be subject to a petition process by the affected customers, or the company could apply to the Commission for an increase in the local rates. The two tables at the end of this section provide a history of the local rate changes as well as the current local rates charged by the incumbent carriers in the State. The local rates listed have not changed from those listed in our previous report.

The passage of the 1996 Telecommunications Act allowed for competing carriers to provide local service using their own facilities or by leasing the existing network to enter the telecommunications market. Competitive Local Exchange Carriers, (CLECs), have used various means of marketing to provide service to both residential and business customers, and now have a 29.8% share of the total access lines served in the State as of December 31, 2005. The next largest share of the market for the same period is Qwest at 28%. The largest of the CLEC's, Cox Communications, now serves 15% of the market with 149,097 customers in the Omaha area.

2. Financial Statistics

The financial information related to local exchange company earnings is not being reported for 2005. Competition in this market and company-specific data may reveal competitively sensitive information. Thus, the annual reports filed by the local exchange companies remain available at the Commission for use by Commissioners and Commission staff. Portions of the reports that are not proprietary are available for public inspection.

3. Long Distance Telephone Rates/Access Charges

Long distance and local carriers share in the provision of long distance service to customers. Local carriers receive access revenues from long distance companies for their provision of originating or terminating long distance calls within the State. Long distance rates are then based on these wholesale costs for the service. Other means of compensation, such as reciprocal compensation for originating or terminating local calls are also in place to compensate carriers for provision of calls of a local nature. This system of payments between communications providers for carrying traffic across their network is known as intercarrier compensation. Due to changes that have taken place in the industry in recent years, with the increased wireless usage and the introduction of Voice Over Internet Protocol (VoIP) services, there has been a recognized need to reform the existing intercarrier compensation structure.

The National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC) created a task force in 2003 to examine a number of intercarrier compensation proposals, which had been filed with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). In May of 2004, NARUC adopted and filed intercarrier compensation policy principles developed through their task force. Since that time, thirteen industry workshops and numerous conference calls with up to 50+ stakeholders from telecommunications industries have been held to try and reach a consensus on a new form of intercarrier compensation. Since it appeared that this group was too large for a meaningful consensus, the Chair of the task force appointed a group of 11 stakeholders to develop a compromise proposal to bring back to the larger group for discussion. This resulted in the "Missoula Plan" which was presented to the larger group in March of 2006. The NARUC Task Force on Intercarrier Compensation agreed to file this plan for consideration with the FCC and the proposal was filed on July 24, 2006.

The impact of changes in this compensation proposal could affect local carriers (ILECs and CLECs), long distance providers, internet service providers, voice over internet protocol (VoIP) providers, cellular companies, or any company exchanging traffic over the public switched telephone network. The Missoula Plan is pending now before the FCC with initial comments due on October, 25, 2006.

C. Explanation of Charges Which May Appear on Your Telephone Bill

Basic Residential Line - The monthly rate for providing service to a residence (home or apartment) and includes local calling within the exchange.

Extended Area Service - The monthly charge for provision of local calling to other exchanges in addition to the customer serving exchange.

Number Portability Charge - A charge set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to cover a part of the costs of facility upgrades necessary to allow customers to retain their telephone number when changing from one local service provider to another.

Federal Access Charge (Federal Subscriber Line Charge) - A charge set by the FCC to cover part of a local telephone company's cost of operating and maintaining its local telephone network. This charge is currently capped at \$6.50 per month for the first residential line and single business lines, but the actual charge can vary by company.

Telecommunications Dual-Party Relay Fund (Nebraska Relay Fund) - A charge set by the Nebraska Public Service Commission to provide a statewide telecommunications relay system and a statewide voucher program for the provision of specialized telecommunications equipment for qualified deaf, hard-of-hearing, or speech-impaired persons in Nebraska which enables them to communicate twenty-four hours per day, seven-days-per-week, with other persons without such disabilities. The charge is currently set at \$.05 per access line.

911 Service Surcharge - A charge assessed by the city or county to provide funding to operate emergency service centers. Typically this charge is between \$.50 and \$1.00 per month per access line.

Wireless E911 Surcharge - A charge assessed by the state to provide funding to implement wireless E911. Currently the charge is \$.50 per wireless subscriber per month.

Nebraska Universal Service Fund - A charge set by the Nebraska Public Service Commission to provide funds to local exchange companies to assist in the provision of services to high-cost areas and low-income customers. This charge is 5.75 percent.

Federal Tax (Excise Tax) - A 3 percent tax that funds general government operations and will appear on the local portion of the bill.

State Tax (Sales Tax) - The state sales tax, which is 5.5 percent of the Nebraska portion of the bill, to fund general government obligations. This tax will appear on both the local and the long distance portion of the bill.

City Tax (Sales Tax, if applicable) - The rate varies by city, but the funds will go towards general municipal obligations.

City Tax (Occupation or Franchise Tax, if applicable) - The percentage (varies by city) assessed by the city to the telephone company and passed on to the customers, for the right to do business.

Federal Universal Service Fund - (Rate varies with each company) A Federal charge assessed to companies to support low-income consumers, consumers in high-cost areas, and support for schools, libraries, and rural health care providers.

PART V

Recommendations for the 2007 Legislative Session

The Commission, as of the date of this Annual Report, recommends the Legislature consider the following legislation relating to telecommunications for the 2007 Session:

- Legislation to modify the definition of “Telecommunications Company” to clarify that interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol Service Providers fall within the definition consistent with recent FCC orders.
- Legislation to amend NUSF policy statement to be consistent with the recent FCC orders.
- Legislation to amend the Enhanced Wireless 911 Services Act to require wireless carriers to pursue non-payment of the Wireless E911 surcharge by subscribers as they would under their normal collection practices consistent with the current requirements of the NUSF.
- Legislation to amend the Enhanced Wireless 911 Services Act to exempt paging companies and others whose devices are not capable of dialing 911 from the requirement to collect and remit the Wireless E911 surcharge.
- Legislation to amend the Enhanced Wireless 911 Services Act to make wireless carriers liable for the costs of audits consistent with the current requirements of the NUSF.
- Legislation to amend the Telecommunications Relay System Act to require carriers to pursue non-payment of the Telecommunications Relay System Surcharge by subscribers as they would under their normal collection practices consistent with the current requirements of the NUSF.
- Legislation to modify the membership of the Enhanced Wireless 911 Advisory Board to include a representative of the State Patrol and a representative of the general public.
- Legislation to amend the Emergency Telephone Communications Systems Act to clarify that Voice over Internet Protocol Service Providers must collect and remit the landline 911 surcharges imposed by local government.
- Legislation to create a registry of all unregulated telecommunications providers and information service providers.
- Legislation to give the Commission limited authority over wireless carriers to resolve consumer billing and contract disputes.
- Legislation to exempt municipal occupation taxes on telecommunications services from sales tax.

The Commission and its staff are available to review any proposed telecommunications legislation for the benefits of the Legislature and its Committees. Senators and legislative staff are invited to contact Andy Pollock, Executive Director, at 471-0211, to request a review of proposed legislation at any stage of the legislative process or with any questions concerning telecommunications or its oversight.

PART VI

The Changing Face of Communications

The three new issues identified in the last Annual Report continue to evolve and provide new opportunities for customers and new challenges for the Commission.

A. Broadband

Broadband is a generic term commonly used to refer to Internet access through some means other than dial-up. For years, "broadband" has referred to a higher-speed connection, but the actual speed threshold has varied. The FCC uses the term "high speed" to describe services that provide the subscriber with transmission speeds in excess of 200 kilobits per second (kbps) in at least one direction. "Advanced services", which provide the subscriber with transmission speeds in excess of 200 kbps in both directions is considered a subset of "high speed services". The typical forms of transport for broadband are DSL, cable-modem, wireless, optical fiber, and satellite technologies.

DSL broadband service uses the installed telephone wiring, and is typically provided over the incumbent local exchange carriers' facilities, and is limited to a distance of about three miles from the central office. Remote or cable modem is typically provided by the local video cable company and requires connection to the cable provider. Depending upon the data transmission speed desired, DSL and cable modem service are usually similar in cost and effectiveness.

Wireless and satellite technologies continue to gain broadband market shares to provide coverage to areas that are beyond the maximum distance for DSL or where video cable service is not available. While wireless and satellite service is typically more costly than DSL or cable modem, competition and equipment technology is bringing the price points closer together.

Because broadband is traditionally used to access the Internet, and Internet related services, broadband service has been defined by the Federal Communications Commission as "information services" and therefore is not under the regulatory authority of states. As more and more of the Internet related services offered to the citizens of Nebraska require broadband connectivity, broadband availability will become a larger issue. The NPSC has undertaken a survey to document the availability of broadband to the citizens of Nebraska. The report is available at the PCS's website: www.psc.state.ne.us.

B. Broadband over Power Line

Broadband over Power Line (BPL) is a technology used to deliver high-speed data to end-users over existing electric power networks and lines.

BPL, also known as power-line communication, utilizes electric power distribution wires for the high-speed transmission of data by transmitting high-frequency data signals through the same power distribution network used for carrying electric power to household users. In a common form of BPL, the broadband connection is provided over the electrical wires that enter a

house; a customer can obtain Internet access by plugging a BPL modem into any residential electric outlet served by the BPL system. In another form of BPL, Internet access is provided using a wireless device (such as a WiFi access point) connected to a BPL distribution system outside of the home that communicates with the customer's computer or other equipment inside the home. It is important to note that BPL technology, in its current form, is not suitable for carrying broadband signals over long distances. A typical BPL signal will only propagate along a power line for 1,000 to 3,000 feet before it becomes too weak or distorted to be useful.

While innovation and technology continue to expand the capability of BPL, in its current form it does not appear to be a cost effective method of providing ubiquitous broadband in Nebraska.

C. Voice over Internet Protocol

Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) is a technology that provides a voice communication service by transmitting the conversation between two parties as discrete digital packages of information over a dedicated network instead of the traditional public switched telephone network (PSTN).

In just a few short years VoIP has moved from a novelty used by hobbyists to a mainstream commercial product. The major differences between a traditional telephone call and a VoIP call is the conversion of the customer's analog voice signal into a digital signal and the way in which the data is then transmitted to the called party. Equipment at the consumer's location is used to convert the analog voice signal to a stream of digital information. The digital information is divided into a series of individual "packets" that are sent over a dedicated transmission facility to the termination point. The method of transmission used is called "internet protocol" giving rise to the name of the service; Voice Over Internet Protocol. At the receiving end the packets of digital information are converted back into an analog signal for use on the called party's telephone.

Another way of visualizing this process is to consider that the conversation is occurring as a written exchange between two people through a series of individual letters, each letter having just a few words of the conversation. Depending upon which digital data packets are missing, out of order, or corrupted, the voice conversation may either have gaps or be hard to understand. Due to quality of service (QoS) issues most commercial VoIP services do not use the traditional Internet networks to transmit the voice packets; instead dedicated networks are used to ensure the required transmission qualities.

Typically a voice conversation between two VoIP customers from the same service provider will occur over the providers dedicated network and never reaches the PSTN much like a call between two telephones in an office that is served by a PBX (Private Branch eXchange). A voice conversation between a VoIP customer and a customer of a traditional telephone service provider is different from the respect that the call must travel on the PSTN at some point. In the traditional telephone service environment when telephone calls are passed from the customers of one company and the customers of another company, there are charges associated with the communication called "access" and "transmission". Because of the network design employed by VoIP providers they are able to minimize the amount of "transmission" charges and when the call is between two of their customers, even if the parties are located in different cities, the "access" charges do not apply.

Because VoIP service providers are not required at this time to be licensed, certified, or register with either the FCC or a state agency, we cannot accurately identify how many and which VoIP service providers are offering services in Nebraska at this time. To date, the only certified VoIP service provider in Nebraska is Time Warner Cable, which applied for and was issued a certificate on November 23, 2004, in Application No. C-3228.

PART VII

Applications and Tariffs

The Commission received a total of 210 applications during the period of July 1, 2005, to June 30, 2006. Much of the activity involved competition in the local market where additional carriers applied for local authority and interconnection agreement approval requests were received. Following is a summary of the applications received during this period.

PART VIII

Nebraska Telecommunication Infrastructure & Public Safety Department

1. Nebraska Universal Service Fund

Purpose

To ensure that all Nebraskans have access to quality telecommunications and information services at affordable and comparable rates. To accomplish this goal, the Commission has created three programs within the Nebraska Universal Service Fund.

1. High Cost Program, which seeks to make telecommunications and information rates generally affordable and comparable across Nebraska.
2. Nebraska Telephone Assistance Program (NTAP), which was formerly known as the Lifeline/Link-Up Program. This program provides discounted rates to qualifying low-income Nebraskans.
3. Rural Tele-Health Program which supports the provision of telecommunications services to a statewide tele-health network.

Legislative History

In 1997, the Legislature passed LB 686, authorizing the Commission to create the Nebraska Universal Service Fund (NUSF). The goal of the NUSF is, in conjunction with federal universal service funds, to ensure that all Nebraskans have comparable access to telecommunications services at affordable prices. In 1999, the Legislature passed LB 514, exempting persons receiving support from the Lifeline/Link-Up program from any NUSF surcharge. In 2001 and 2002, the Legislature passed LB 389 and LB 1211, respectively, clarifying the Commission's NUSF authority regarding wireless companies. Also, in 2002, the Legislature passed LB 1105, which re-codified the applicable NUSF statutes from §§ 86-1401 to 86-1411 to §§ 86-316 to 86-329. LB 37, passed in 2002, during the special session, allows the State to borrow monies from the Universal Service Fund with the following caveats: a 60-day reserve must be maintained in the Fund, and interest of five percent must be paid on any monies borrowed for more than 30 days. The borrowing provisions sunset on June 30, 2007. In 2004, LB 1004 changed the name of the Lifeline/Link-Up Program to the Nebraska Telephone Assistance Program.

Assessment

The Commission, by order and after public hearing, revised the NUSF surcharge from 6.95 percent to 5.75 percent of in-state retail telecommunications revenue beginning October 1, 2005 through June 30, of 2006. Interstate and Internet services are not subject to the NUSF surcharge. The Commission determines assessable services through the use of Federal Communications Commission (FCC) federal universal service definitions in order to reduce the amount of duplicate administrative work for telecommunications providers. Specific categories of services subject to the NUSF surcharge are:

- Local service, including connection charges, enhanced service, such as Caller ID, and extended area services (EAS).
- Wireless services, including cellular, PCS, and paging.
- In-state long distance services, including prepaid calling card, operator-assisted, collect, calling card and private line.

NUSF Remittances and Payments

The Commission projected that the NUSF surcharge would generate \$57.3 million during the July 2005 through June 2006, fiscal year. During this period, the NUSF collected \$53.4 million, a variance of -7.0 percent. The Commission projected that during this same period; the NUSF would pay out \$78.7 million. During this period, \$79.5 million was actually paid to telecommunication providers, a variance of 1.0 percent. This is due to specific network upgrades that have been distributed because the projects are completed. During the 2005-2006 fiscal year, the NUSF processed 2,450 remittances and made 1,470 disbursements.

As of the beginning of January 2005, the NUSF had a balance of 63.4 million. As of June 30, 2006, that balance had declined to \$37.9 million. Previously, the NUSF was estimated to have a fund balance of \$39.1 million as of June 30, 2006, compared to the actual balance of \$37.9 million.

Significant Issues

1. The Commission has opened docket NUSF-50 to determine revisions in the high cost program to reflect the decreased surcharge.
2. The Commission continues to work with the Nebraska Hospital Association to develop a statewide tele-health network. The Commission has reserved \$900,000 a year for this purpose. These monies will be distributed only to eligible telecommunication companies that provide the connections for this network.
3. The expansion of broadband and Voice of Internet Protocol (VoIP) services: In many instances, these services replace traditional telephone services. It remains unclear whether these services can be required to contribute to universal service. In some cases, these services are not required to contribute, which is one factor in receipts declining.

4. The Commission continues to implement its December 7, 2004 NUSF-2 order revising the NTAP eligibility standards and program requirements. This has resulted in the need to re-certify more than 20,000 individuals on a regular basis. The Commission continues to increase enrollment in the program.

Nebraska Tele-Health Program

In September of 2004, the Commission approved funding for the Nebraska Statewide Tele-Health Network. This network will connect 68 rural and critical access hospitals across the state to hub hospitals in Grand Island, Kearney, Lincoln, Norfolk, North Platte, Omaha, and Scottsbluff.

To date the Commission has funded 63 hospitals and expended \$322,199.36. Expenditures were lower than expected due to network configuration issues. As of June, 2006, all of the hospitals participating in the network were connected to the network.

. Nebraska Telephone Assistance Program

In 2003, the Commission changed the name of the Nebraska Lifeline and Link-Up programs to the Nebraska Telephone Assistance Program or NTAP. This was done to distinguish the program from the Lifeline medical alert service. NTAP assists qualifying low-income individuals with obtaining and keeping telephone services by lowering monthly service and connection rates. The Commission has adopted a policy to maximize the amount of federal support for the NTAP. At a minimum, federal support is available to waive the federal subscriber line charge (SLC), which ranges between \$3.50 per month and \$6.50 per month, and reduce basic local exchange rates by \$1.75 per month. Additional federal matching support is available, equal to one-half of any state support, up to a maximum of \$1.75 per month. The Nebraska Universal Service Fund provides support of \$3.50 per month so that the NTAP can receive this additional \$1.75 per month in federal support. As a result, an additional \$5.25 per month in support is available to qualifying Nebraska telephone subscribers. Customers receive a total credit of between \$10.00 and \$13.50 on their bill. To qualify for the NTAP, a consumer must participate in one of the following programs:

- 1) Medicaid;
- 2) Food Stamps;
- 3) Supplemental Security Income (SSI);
- 4) Federal Public Housing Assistance;
- 5) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP); and
- 6) Children Health Insurance Programs (Kids Connection, SAM, MAC, E-MAC)

The Childrens Health Insurance Programs were added during the last year as a result of the Commission's NUSF-2 Order, dated December 7, 2004.

The NTAP also provides a credit of 50 percent, up to \$30.00, for one-time connection on a single line of service, free toll blocking, and a deferred payment schedule for charges to establish service on which the consumer does not pay interest. This is provided solely through

federal support, although the NUSF does cover administrative costs; and eligibility is based on the same criteria list above. Federal support is now available to low- income consumers living on tribal lands up to an additional \$25.00 per month. This increased support cannot bring the basic local exchange rate below \$1.00 per month. Additionally, federal support of up to \$100 is available to consumers living on tribal lands to reduce the initial connections and line extension charges. Further, eligibility criteria for consumers living in tribal areas has been expanded to include the following additional federal assistance programs:

- 1) Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance;
- 2) Tribally-administered Temporary Assistance for Needy Families;
- 3) Head Start (only those meeting its income qualifying standard); or
- 4) National School Lunch Program's free lunch program.

Currently, approximately 27,000 Nebraskans are enrolled in the NTAP program and receive support from the NUSF. This represents an increase of 13% since June 2005. The Commission is currently working on a cooperative effort with Health and Human Services to mail pre-approved NTAP applications to persons that are currently enrolled in the Medicaid, Food Stamps and Childrens Health Insurance programs but not enrolled in the NTAP. Since September 2003, 100,000 pre-approved applications have been mailed to eligible persons. More than 15,000 of those applications have been returned and processed.

The Commission continues to work with Health and Human Services (HHS) offices, area aging agencies, housing authorities and others across the state to provide information about the NTAP.

2. Wireless E911 Fund

What is Wireless 9-1-1?

In most areas of North America, citizens have basic or enhanced 9-1-1 service from their landline, or wireline, phones in their homes or workplaces. Basic 9-1-1 means that when someone dials 9-1-1, no location or identifying information is automatically transmitted. This information must be communicated by the calling party to the call taker/dispatcher in the local public safety answering point (PSAP) or 9-1-1 center. In areas with Enhanced 9-1-1, the telecommunications network transmits location or identifying information automatically and the local 9-1-1 center has equipment and database information that allow the call taker to see the caller's phone number and address on a display. This allows the 9-1-1 center to quickly dispatch emergency help, even if the caller is unable to communicate where they are or what the emergency is.

Three Phases of Wireless 9-1-1

There are three phases of Wireless 9-1-1. The most basic of these, sometimes called "Wireless Phase 0," simply means that when you dial 9-1-1 from your cell phone a call taker at a public safety answering point (PSAP) answers. The call taker may be at a state highway patrol PSAP, at a city or county PSAP up to hundreds of miles away, or at a local PSAP, depending on how the wireless 9-1-1 call is routed. The call taker doesn't receive the callback phone number or the location of the caller. This presents life threatening problems due to lost response time, if callers are unable to speak or don't know where they are, or if they don't know their wireless phone callback number and the call is dropped.

Wireless Phase I is the first step in providing better emergency response service to wireless 9-1-1 callers. When Phase I has been implemented, a wireless 9-1-1 call will come into the PSAP with the wireless phone's call-back number and the location of the wireless tower that receives the call. This allows the PSAP to determine the general location of the calling party usually, within a few square miles. This is important in the event the cell phone call is dropped, and may even allow PSAP employees to work with the wireless company to identify the wireless subscriber.

To more effectively locate wireless 9-1-1 callers, Phase II must be implemented by local 9-1-1 systems and wireless carriers. Phase II allows call-takers to receive both the caller's wireless phone number and their specific location by latitude and longitude.

9-1-1 Technologies

Wireless carriers have two types of location technologies available to choose from. They are network-based and handset-based. Of the carriers offering service in Nebraska, Alltel, Cricket, Nextel, Sprint PCS, US Cellular and Verizon utilize a handset-based solution. Cingular, I Wireless, Pinpoint Wireless, T-Mobile and Viaero utilize a network-based solution.

When a wireless phone is turned on, whether or not it is being used, it periodically transmits signals so the wireless network knows where to deliver calls. With the network-based solution, special radio intercept equipment is installed on the cellular towers. When a call is placed, the towers can compare signals from any active cell phone and pinpoint the call using triangulation (the difference in time between the arrival of the signal at different receiving stations or by the signal's angle of arrival at each tower.) It takes at least three towers to get a good location. This solution is called network-based because the signal measurements and location calculations are performed in the cellular network.

The handset-based solution utilizes a cell phone equipped with Global Positioning System (GPS) equipment that can measure the time of arrival of signals transmitted from GPS satellites in order to calculate its position.

Carriers that use network-based technologies are required to provide location information that is accurate to within 100 meters 67% of the time and accurate within 300 meters 95% of the time. Carriers that use handset-based technologies must provide greater location accuracy: 50 meter accuracy 67% of the time and 150 meter accuracy 95% of the time.

Once a carrier using a handset-based technology receives a Phase II request, they have six months to install the necessary equipment and begin delivering the service to the requesting PSAP. Carriers using network-based solutions must provide Phase II for at least 50 percent of the PSAP's coverage area or population within six months after the request and for 100 percent of the PSAP's coverage area within 18 months.

Wireless E9-1-1 in Nebraska

Effective July 1, 2001, a 50-cent surcharge has been collected for each subscriber with a billing address in Nebraska. Wireless carriers remit the surcharge to the Public Service Commission 60 days after the last day of the month. From July 2005 through June 2006 the fund collected \$6,407,924 and paid out \$4,516,384.

Legislative Changes: LB 1222 [2006]

LB 1222, passed by the Legislature this past session, made significant changes to the Enhanced Wireless 911 Services Act. Those changes include:

- Requiring the collection of the enhanced wireless 911 surcharge by prepaid wireless carriers effective July 1, 2007.
- Reporting requirements for wireless carriers
- Raising the surcharge cap for all but Douglas County from \$.50 to \$.70.
- Allowing the Commission to establish a mechanism for determining levels of funding and giving the Commission discretion to pay less than 100% cost recovery to PSAPs and wireless carriers.
- Allowing the Commission to designate a county to receive wireless E911 calls for a county that is not enhanced.

The bill contained an emergency clause and was effective April 13, 2006. The Commission is currently in the process of implementing the provisions of LB 1222.

Status of 911 in Nebraska

There have been a total of 57 counties that have implemented Phase I. Of those 57, there are four counties who have also implemented Phase II. There are 11 counties with Basic 911, 12 counties in the process of implementing E911, and 12 counties who are enhanced 911 awaiting Wireless 911 Phase I implementation.

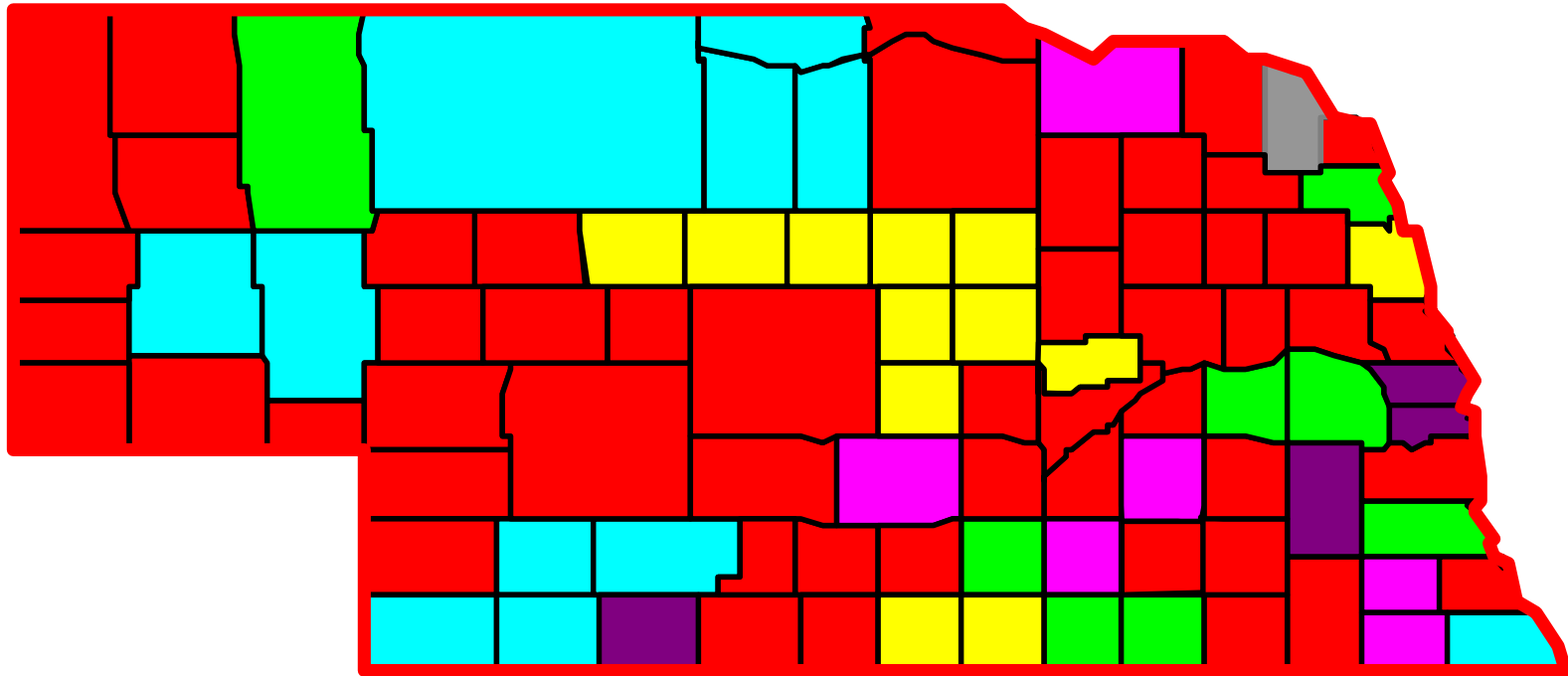

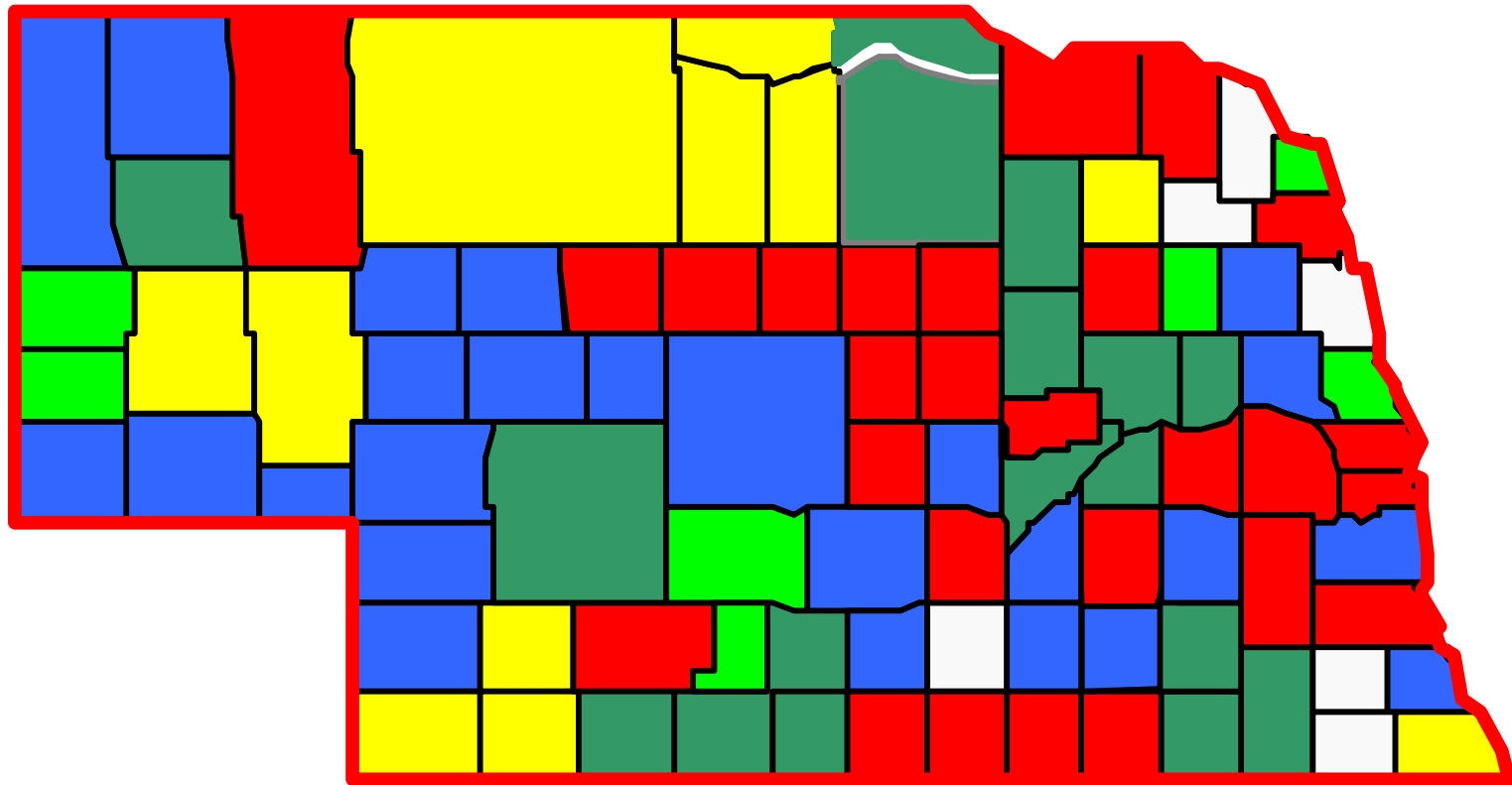

Summary of Significant Dockets Relating to Enhanced Wireless 911

The following is a description of significant pending dockets related to enhanced wireless 911.

Docket 911-016/PI-114: In the Matter of the Nebraska Public Service Commission, on its own motion, to investigate issues associated with implementing landline enhanced 911 in counties with basic landline 911.

The Commission opened this docket to investigate costs associated with implementing landline enhanced 911 in counties with basic landline 911.

Docket 911-017/PI-116: In the Matter of the Nebraska Public Service Commission, on its own motion, to establish interim policies for the Administration of the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund pending Implementation of LB 1222 [2006].

The full implementation of LB 1222 will require significant time and multiple workshops and hearings. In order to ensure that the implementation of enhanced wireless 911 would continue pending that implementation, the Commission opened this docket to establish interim policies for the administration of the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund. Staff has released a proposed policy and is currently seeking comments from interested parties.

Docket 911-018/PI-117: In the Matter of the Nebraska Public Service Commission, on its own motion, seeking to establish audit requirements related to the Wireless Enhanced 911 Fund.

In response to suggestions offered during the most recent state audit, this docket was opened to establish audit requirements related to the Wireless Enhanced 911 Fund and wireless carriers. Staff has proposed a policy and is seeking comments from all interested parties.

Docket 911-019/PI-118: In the Matter of the Nebraska Public Service Commission, on its own motion, to implement provisions of LB 1222 [2006] and to establish a permanent funding mechanism for wireless enhanced 911 service.

The Commission opened this docket to implement provisions of LB 1222 [2006] and to establish a permanent funding mechanism for wireless enhanced 911 service. This docket is likely to require numerous workshops and hearings.
