

Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)

This **federal government program** provides eligible households with \$30* off any Cox Internet plan. It also gives people the ability to purchase a computer for as low as \$25 using the \$100 ACP equipment credit.

- ACP is available to new and existing customers who meet at least one of the following:
 - Participate in a government assistance program such as Medicaid or Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
 - Subscribe to Cox Connect2Compete or Lifeline
 - Have a household income less than 200% of the federal poverty guidelines (As of January 2023, \$29,160 for an individual plus \$10,280 for each additional person in your household. For example, that's up to \$60,000 for a family of four)
- No credit check, no deposit, and no late fees

Internet Plan for Families with Children in K-12

Our Connect2Compete program opens a world of opportunity for families with children in grades K-12 by providing them with home internet for \$9.95/month.

- **Available to new and existing Cox customers/households** with one or more students in K-12 and currently participating in a qualifying government assistance program such as the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) or Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Up to 100/5 Mbps for \$9.95/month or free when used with the Affordable Connectivity Program
- Includes Cox wifi modem
- Access to 3M+ wifi hotspots nationwide
- Options for low-cost computers and use of the Cox Digital Academy (Digital library/resource center)
- No credit check, no deposit, no term agreement, no upfront costs, and no late fees

Internet Plan for People in Low Income Households

For those on a tight budget, this \$30/month internet plan is a great option for the reliable internet they need.

- Available to new and existing customers who meet at least one of the following:
 - Participate in a government assistance program such as Medicaid or Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
 - Have a household income less than 200% of the federal poverty guidelines (As of January 2023, \$29,160 for an individual plus \$10,280 for each additional person in your household. For example, that's up to \$60,000 for a family of four)
- Up to 100/5 Mbps for \$30/month or free when used with the Affordable Connectivity Program
- Includes Cox Wifi modem
- Access to 3M+ wifi hotspots nationwide
- No credit check, no deposit, no term agreement, no upfront costs, and no late fees

StraightUp Internet

This prepaid internet plan offers month-to-month flexibility and price transparency for a **\$50 flat fee.**

- No need to qualify, this is a Prepaid Plan available to anyone
- Up to 100/5 Mbps for \$50/month or \$20/month when used with the Affordable Connectivity Program
- Access to 3M+ wifi hotspots nationwide
- Includes Cox Wifi modem
- No credit check, no deposit, no term agreement, no proof of identification, no upfront costs, and no late fees

Cox Access Partner Program (CAPP)

Program that enables any third party such as schools, businesses, non-profits or government entities to pay for and subsidize internet service for individual households. **Organizations can subsidize up to 100% towards monthly internet service.**

- Must include at least 25 households
- Individual household must sign up for Cox Residential service in their name
- Can apply to any Cox Residential Service Tier
- Participating households are determined by the organization
- Organization defines monthly subsidy provided
- Organization is invoiced monthly and sends payment directly to Cox



Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)

The mission of Share the Magic Foundation is simple: Get kids excited about reading. For students in households that don't emphasize reading, offering book ownership and inclusive literacy programming is a way to inspire kids to lift their reading scores and prepare for a brighter academic future.

With a fast, reliable internet connection, literacy, and a love of learning, can empower the next generation of leaders together.

"I grew up as a low-income student, so I understand the challenges that exist within the community. Initially, reading was a challenge for me. However, through perseverance, books became an avenue for expanding my curiosity, creativity, and learning.


Focused on expanding internet access
