

## **Digging Safely**

Digging-related activity is the leading cause of natural gas pipeline incidents.

A ruptured natural gas line will have immediate consequences. Furthermore, if you disturb, nick, chip, scratch, or dent a pipeline, or its coating, the resulting damage could serve as a catalyst for a natural gas accident days, weeks, or even years afterwards.

If you suspect that a buried or above ground natural gas pipeline has been damaged, even slightly, immediately leave the area and warn others to stay away. From a safe location, immediately call 911 and the appropriate natural gas utility.

To avoid a costly repair bill and, far more important, keep yourself and other safe:

- Notify the local One Call center by calling the toll-free, nationwide "Call Before You Dig" number (811) at least two full business days before you dig. This <u>free service</u> will notify all of the utilities in your area of your plans.
- Pre-mark the excavation area using white paint or flags to assist the location services.
- Within two business days, representatives from utilities will arrive at your site to mark buried utilities with the corresponding paint color and identification flags.
- After the area has been properly marked, dig with care! Utility lines cannot be exactly pinpointed and the depth cannot be precisely determined.
- If the original markings are unclear, disturbed, or seven days have passed, call to have the locations remarked, at <u>no cost</u> to you, at least two business days before work begins.
