During the closure of schools in the spring of 2020 the lack of reliable internet for some of our students and families became known. Some of our students in rural areas were not able to access classes during this time, or haven't since then if they have had to stay home due to isolation or quarantines.

Some of our families were able to have one child connect with classes, but not all of their children at the same time. We had synchronous classes so the only way a child could participate and learn was by having access when the class or lesson was being broadcast. Since all of this was happening between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., there were many times that children in the same household had overlapping remote learning schedules. Not all of the children in a house were able to get what they needed. Remote learning software like Zoom requires a lot of bandwidth and wouldn't always work.

I hope that through this grant opportunity our students and families will have better and easier access to their teachers. Even when we aren't closed down, so much learning takes place through the internet. Students have homework that requires research and sometimes watching an interview or other streamed information.

Thank you for considering Fillmore County as a recipient of this grant.

Since the pandemic hit, I've worked from home. We are currenting on our second internet service provider during this time due to slow and poor-quality internet. We've even paid extra for a cellular hotspot service that would be concerned as "underserved". Believe it or not, at times we have had both our wireless internet provider and our cellular data connections down. My job with OPPD requires that I have a higher speed and better-quality internet connection.

Rural Nebraska is in a fragile condition. As more and more people leave the rural areas for the "connivences" of the city, we need to look at what can be done to try and keep as many people remaining in these rural areas.
