I am writing to encourage you to approve the requests made by Glenwood Telecommunications, Inc., for funding under the Capital Projects Fund Program throughout parts of Adams County and Kearney County that lie in the 33rd Legislative District, which I have the privilege of serving.




Dear Commissioners,

South Central Economic Development District, Inc. (SCEDD) fully supports the Glenwood Communications application for the Capital Projects Fund-2 (CPF) for the Heartwell rural area of Kearney County to serve 46 locations. We continue to work closely with Glenwood and other providers to examine areas in our 13-county region for potential projects to deploy broadband fiber development, prioritizing the *unserved* rural residents. SCEDD spoke on behalf of the projects at a recent Kearney County Commissioners meeting, further stressing the importance of building out fiber to all residents to improve quality of life measures. SCEDD shared feedback from constituents that there are no providers offering quality reliable internet service at minimum speeds of 25Mbps/3Mbps to many rural households. Kearney County commissioners demonstrated their awareness of the need and voted to support this broadband initiative.

Glenwood is a well-known and established service provider within the SCEDD region that continues to meet promised expectations for delivery of high speed internet with a solid record for past performance. They have funded expansion of broadband capabilities to many rural areas. We are confident their organization has the best interests of the residents of Kearney County in mind with this effort to extend their service area. Glenwood's match contribution is a testament to their business plan to continue investing in local communities for the long-term, while prioritizing broadband fiber access as the gold standard to service areas.

The customer monthly rates Glenwood offers are well within the established CPF-2 affordable guidelines, while still providing the 100 Mbps/100Mbps or greater broadband internet service to their current service areas. Additionally, Glenwood is a participant in the FCC's Affordability Connectivity Program for the monthly discount to qualified households, further demonstrating their commitment to providing quality internet services to all.

SCEDD is confident this CPF-2 grant application serves the unserved rural residents well of Kearney County in the proposed project service area. Broadband infrastructure improvements to this rural area will promote economic development in the areas of housing, agriculture, and business. We are excited to see the Kearney County rural residents served with this vital funding from the Public Service Commission.
